THIS DEED made this 26th day of March Eighteen Hundred and Fifty Seven 1857, Between JAMES W. HARLAN of the first part and JOHN S. MOON of the second part, all of the County of Albemarle Virginia.

Witnesseth that the said JAMES W. HARLAN doth in consideration of the premises and the further consideration of One Dollar to him in hand paid by the said JOHN S. MOON, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said JOHN S. MOON the following property viz:

A certain tract or parcel of land situated in Albemarle County near JOHN H. COLEMAN'S MILL, CONTAINING TWO HUNDRED AND TWENTY FIVE Acres more or less and is the same land upon which the said JAMES W. HARLAN now resides. Also a piece or parcel of land lying north of the PLANT ROAD, containing FORTY FIVE Acres more or less and adjoins the lands of JAMES HANMER AND OTHERS. Also the following slaves viz: WILLIS, HARRY, NELSON, JABOC, SOLOMAN, MARTHA, MOZILLA, ELIZA about forty five or four years old, and her daughter also names ELIZA about sixteen years old, a girl named FANNY and a girl named HELLEN. In trust to secure to JOHN D. MOON, JR. the payment of a Bond for THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS, executed to him by the said JAMES W. HARLAN AND JOHN B. HARLAN dated the 26th March 1857 and is payable on demand with interest from the first day of March 1857 till paid - and the said JAMES W. HARLAN covenants with the said JOHN S. MOON that he will warrant generally the property herein conveyed or intended to be conveyed.
